

# One Hundred Zulu 5.10a, 3p

**Rack:** 60m rope, 14 quickdraws, anchor material

**P1: 28m 5.9 11 bolts** Ascend the deceptively steep cracks to a ledge. Passing the blocky terrain, step out right and finish up the airy arete.

**P2: 28m 5.10a 14 bolts** From the belay perch climb steeping terrain on the lip of the giant roof. Man-handle the big ear before accelerating to a delicate finish.

**P3: 30m 5.9 8 bolts** Neat holds lead to a left or right decision. Finish up the arete to the first anchor and rappel.

*To continue to the top of the bluff extend P3 past 3 more bolts to a higher station. From this anchor traverse directly left to get to Western Harlot. A little scruffy.*

## Descent:

If descending from the summit do the first rappel on Western Harlot. Continue down that route or descend 4 metres past the anchor and traverse around to the top of 100Zulu (29m).

From the top of One Hundred Zulu climb rap to the top of the second pitch (17m or 26m from the higher chains).

At the top of the second pitch the rappel anchor is right next to the climbing station. Rappel slightly to the right of the climb to a hidden anchor on the right of the giant roof (28m). From here it's a 27m rappel to the ground. These two rappels are a little mossy.

**Getting to the Climb:** Follow the cairned and flagged path toward Centurion. About 75m metres before reaching that climb the trail forks and the Western Harlot trail switches back up and right. Following the rough trail aiming for the gully on the right of the formation. Continue along the base of the rock past a very steep wall and crack. Above the rope and rungs trend left. One Hundred Zulu is immediately visible when you reach the wall, Western Harlot is 30 m around the corner to the left.

**Approach to the Outpost:** Follow the Conroy Forest Service Road north past the Forgotten Wall and the Crest on foot, 4x4 or high clearance 2-wheel drive. The second left turn, about 2.4 km past the Forgotten Wall, leads immediately to a parking area and the trail. *On foot, it is about 35 minutes to the trail head from Cheak parking.* Follow the trail, trending north, through forest and boulder field for 15-20 min to the base of the base of Centurion, the largest and north most buttress.
